My husband and I didn't know what to expect going into my C-section for the birth of our daughter, Teagan. A perinatologist had identified her spina bifida less than a week before at one of my last ultrasounds. Part of me is still glad I didn't have more time to think about it, because I would have been filled with worry.

That day was the first time we met Dr. Julian Lin, a spina bifida specialist from OSF HealthCare Illinois Neurological Institute. We quickly learned no two cases are the same.

At just four days old, Teagan was taken into surgery by Dr. Lin. Even after an MRI, he wasn't sure what he would find. It turns out Teagan has one of the rarer and more complex cases of spina bifida because all her spinal column nerves run into a fat mass in her lower back. He removed as much of the mass as possible without affecting the nerves.

When she was 2 ½ years old, she started having extreme pain in her left leg behind the knee. She'd wake up in the middle of the night screaming. Her right leg was already tinier with a loss of feeling.

We called Dr. Lin. An MRI revealed her spinal column was tethered—pulling too tightly. This causes many severe problems and Dr. Lin recommended we do another surgery to relieve the pressure. We went back and forth about doing it because there is no guarantee for spina bifida patients and there were big risks. We knew Dr. Lin was going to have to work around that dangerous fatty mass.

It was excruciating to make the decision to send our little girl into a painful and uncertain situation even though it had the potential to be very beneficial. But our faith and trust in Dr. Lin is why we agreed. He worked carefully to remove the part of her mass that had grown back and relieved the pull of her spinal column. Afterwards, he was very honest with us. This surgery went well, but any future operations may result in paralysis.

There are still everyday struggles she faces, but instead we focus on what she can do and how far she has come. It can be very hard for a 5-year-old, but she is a fighter. She dares to do everything, and we've learned never to doubt her.

I would be lying if I said we are not still scared at times, but we also know we aren't alone. We have found a community and family at OSF HealthCare Illinois Neurological Institute with Dr. Lin and his team. I would never trust her care to anyone but them. Knowing how important our daughter is to everyone there is priceless.

But it isn't just them who give me comfort. There have been so many times I have silently thanked the donors who made all the necessary advancements possible.

YOU made research happen. YOU gave the doctors extra education. And YOU helped them have the right equipment to work so closely on her spine.

Teagan can't put her spina bifida in a closet or under the bed. It is her everyday reality, and it will be something she deals with her whole life. But there is so much hope. Every day we learn more. What was considered impossible five years ago is now routine because of people like you.

I would give anything to help Teagan, and I feel blessed that we live in a community that feels the same way.
